Pharmacy First
Patients can now also get treatment for seven common conditions directly from their local
pharmacy, without the need for a GP appointment or prescription.
It means that community pharmacists can supply prescription-only medicines, including antibiotics
and antivirals where clinically appropriate, to treat these health conditions without the need to visit
a GP:
☐ Sinusitis (12 years +)
□ Sore throat (5 years +)
\square Earache (1 – 17 years)
☐ Infected insect bite (1 year +)
☐ Impetigo (a bacterial skin infection) (1 year +)
☐ Shingles (18 years +)
\Box Uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women (16 – 64 years)
You can get treatment for these conditions by walking into the pharmacy. Usual prescription
charges will apply for the seven common conditions.

First Contact Physio and Mental Health Practitioner

The 5 GP practices in the North Cotswolds jointly employ a First Contact Physiotherapist, Steven Clark and a Mental Health Practitioner, Louise Neville.

Patients can book appointments directly with Steve and Louise, via Reception, and appointments are offered at various locality.

If you have joint, muscle and / or nerve pain Steve can see you without a GP appointment being needed. He will assess and diagnose what is happening, give expert advice on how to manage the condition and refer you to specialist services as necessary.

Louise provides specialist mental health support with an aim of improving early access to mental health information, advice, guidance and signposting. She can help patients focus on their goals and support access to local community services as well as providing brief interventions to support mental health recovery.

Distance from Waiting Room to Consulting Rooms

We've had some feedback about the distance from the waiting room to some of the consulting rooms. If you have compromised mobility or have concerns about walking to the consulting rooms, please mention this to the Receptionist when you arrive.

If you would prefer to do the journey in 2 halves, we have chairs at the end of the first corridor and patients are welcome to wait there once they have checked in. We also have wheelchairs available and staff will be happy to support as required.

Technology and Digital Inclusion Social Prescribing Link Worker

The North Cotswolds Primary Care Network (group of 5 GP practices in the North Cotswolds) have funded a Technology and Digital Inclusion Social Prescribing Link Worker with an aim to reduce the digital divide in the North Cotswolds. Jason will be supporting patients with digital tools and skills such as accessing the NHS App and online services.
